“Universities and Trump: Lessons and Needs for Reform”

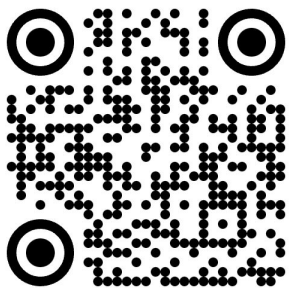
